The Curriculum

Attendance

Children are admitted in the September in the year of their fifth birthday provided that the school has sufficient resources of staff, accommodation and equipment. They normally transfer to High School in the year in which they attain their eleventh birthday.

8 pupils left at the end of the summer term 2022 - 4 went to Welshpool, 3 went to Llanfyllin and 1 went to The Marches.

There is wheelchair access to the school and two disabled toilets and one with changing facilities.

Additional Learning Needs Policy

The school's provision of Additional Learning Needs complies with the Code of Practice.

Mrs Hughes is the Additional Learning Needs Coordinator (ALNCo). Children with special needs are mainly taught in class with support from teaching assistants. If a child is withdrawn it is to specifically work on a particular teaching and learning experience with a teacher or TA.

Mrs Karen Clewlow is the nominated Governor with responsibility for ALN.

Sport

We still were challenged by the impact of Covid this year but we were able to increase the sporting opportunities for the learners. Swimming lessons restarted. Parents were given the option for a outdoor and adventurous residential for the learners or a day of activities, it was agreed that a day of activities would be the preferred option. We were very fortunate to have a full day of activities at Red Ridge Centre.

We were able to restart our after-school football club in the summer term with the support of Llanymynech Junior Football Club Coach.

It has been a positive start to September 2022. Fols fundraising has a re- branding and eye-catching Facebook page. Promoting fresh new ideas to raising money. There is a strong continued support for the school which is now engaging with new families for the future.

The funds raised this year will be used to pay towards updating more IT equipment and replacing all the Interactive Whiteboards. The school are also looking at replacing lots of small sports equipment, as well as paying for extra experiences and treats for the children to enjoy such as transport to the pantomime.

Links with the Community

The school has strong links with St. Tysilio Church, our weekly assemblies with Mrs Dixon have been able to return to face to face. The school is very proud of its reputation within the community. The school continues to promote its links with the community and is very aware of its role in the life of the village and wider area. Class 3 worked with local businesses in the summer term during their enterprise project.

The school also maintains its strong links with Welshpool and Llanfyllin High Schools. Parents attend the open evenings at both schools before their child is due to move up to High School; following this the pupils attend induction days at the end of their last term in Year 6.
